

ATN 164: Screen to Prevent Summary

Study Description

Screen to Prevent (S2P) takes place in pediatric Emergency Departments (ED), and the main goal is to **increase HIV screening rates** among youth and **find out the best way** to do so.

We will use a computerized survey to **find youth that might qualify for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)** – medication to prevent HIV. The study will also use a **texting tool to help youth get started on PrEP** and connected to care. This study is for most youth that come into pediatric EDs.

Why is this study important?

We hope S2P will be an important step towards **more young people getting tested for HIV** and started on PrEP or HIV treatment, if needed, in the ED – which is **the only place many teens get healthcare**.

Who can participate?

- Ages 14–24
- Cisgender women
- Sexual minority men
- Transgender and gender diverse people
