TechStep	TechStep is a tech-based intervention for trans youth that uses a tailored WebApp and e-coaching to motivate HIV risk reduction, like taking PrEP.	5	16% of 254
COMPARE	COMPARE is looking for differences between two HIV prevention apps. Each app's components will be combined into a composite for public dissemination.	9	13% of 381
youthrive	YouTHrive is an adapted version of the "Thrive With Me" intervention to support youth living with HIV by providing peer support, resources, and self-monitoring.	7	6% of 208


### **Background**



Individuals were recruited using a variety of online and in-person strategies, including social media ads, outreach events, and collaborations with community partners.


The following charts describe basic characteristics of 254 participants in iTech studies at this research site.

#### Racial Identity (%)\*






#### **Gender Identity (%)\*\***
